Job Description & Primary Purpose:

Onboard Salish Sea Eclipse as Master, you are a leader of a professional marine team who inspires and educates passengers from all over the world! You will be working with a team who is outgoing and passionate about sharing their knowledge of our BC coast and its wildlife.

As a Master 150 Gross Tonnage, you are responsible for the safe operation of the vessel, it's crew and passengers. As a leader in the industry you are also responsible for ensuring that both Salish Sea Dream and Salish Sea Freedom are operated in accordance with Marine Industry Standards.

As part of the Salish Sea Eclipse team you are responsible for:

- Operating the vessel in accordance with:
 - Transport Canada Standards,
 - Canada Shipping Act and it's regulations.
- Maintaining vessel logs.
- Conducting crew drills as required by Transport Canada and company SOP's.
- Start up and shutdown of the vessel each working day with the assistance of the Chief Mate.
- Ensuring the vessel is ready for the start of the next day.
- Working with the shore crews in providing our guests with the best possible experience.
- Operating in accordance with the Whale Watching Guidelines as set out by the PWWA.
- Assisting in the day to day maintenance of the vessel.
- Vessel Refit
 - Help prepare the vessels at the start of the season including Transport Canada Safety Inspections
 - Help shutting down and winterizing the vessels at the end of the season.

Required Skills and Personal Attributes:

- Master 150 Gross Tonnage, Domestic Certificate.
- ROC-MC (VHF Radio License – Marine Commercial).
- Marine Advanced First Aid.
- MED – STCW Basic Safety.
- MED – Survival Craft, other than fast rescue boats.
- MED – Advanced Firefighting.
- SEN Limited.
- Up to date and approved Transport Canada Medical examination.
- Working knowledge of the PWWA Regulations.
- To be able to work in a team environment.
- Good interpersonal skills with passengers and crew.
- Ability to work on your feet for up to 12 hours.
- Previous experience in the whale watching industry and knowledge of local marine environments is considered an asset but not required.
- An understanding of electrical and mechanical systems including light marine diesel engines combined with the ability to diagnose, troubleshoot and repair small electrical/mechanical problems on the vessel.
